

# 20% increase in numbers taking part in HEE's National Education and Training Survey

The number of learners taking part in Health Education England's (HEE) 2020 National Education and Training Survey (NETS) is up 20% with nearly 37,000 respondents compared to last year, despite the challenges posed by the pandemic.

Over 90% of respondents who took part in the survey said that their overall clinical supervision was positive.

First piloted in 2018 and run twice a year, the survey is the only one of its type to cover multiple professions and the survey results provide vital feedback used to improve the quality of clinical placements across England.

NETS gathers opinions from students about their time in clinical placements to capture feedback on their learning experiences, what they thought worked well and what they think could be improved. As many students were undertaking clinical placements during the pandemic surges they were provided an additional opportunity to comment on their experience and on any impact this had on the quality of their training.
