Background

At the time of applying for the HEE/NIHR CAIP* I was working as a clinical lead in musculoskeletal physiotherapy. I had previously undertaken Masters standalone clinical modules but had little experience of research methodology and approaches. I had unanswered questions in my clinical practice and wanted to start to get involved in the delivery of research and contribute to the evidence



base. I felt that the CAIP would enable me to develop my research knowledge and understanding and be a stepping stone in developing a clinical academic research career along-side my current clinical role.

About the project

My study title was "An exploration of clinician experiences on the role of suprascapular nerve block injections in the non-surgical management of shoulder pain: a Focus Group Study".

Benefits

Following the completion of the CAIP I was successful in gaining a place on a full time HEE/NIHR MRes programme at Coventry University. The MRes programme has further built upon the learning and knowledge I gained through the CAIP. My initial research question / idea from the CAIP has followed into my MRes programme where I have undertaken an independent research study.

What has it allowed me to achieve in my research career?
