Working with you to help allied health professionals and healthcare scientists return to practice

Health Education England's Return to Practice (RtP) programme has been developed to help AHPs and healthcare scientists that have left their professions, to re-enter and gain their HCPC registration.

The programme was piloted in the East Midlands during 2017 and includes the following elements:

- Guidance on the RtP process for AHPs and healthcare scientists
- Signposting of information
- Online resources http://bit.ly/2BkINrH
- Joint working with professional bodies, NHS Trusts and universities to improve the process, information and availability of placements
- Funding to cover out of pocket expenses for eligible returners
- Ongoing support and advice during their journey
- A press and social media campaign to attract new returners
