The Jamie Rentoul Scholarship scheme now open for applications

We are continuing the Jamie Rentoul Scholarship for 2023/24 to allow HEE colleagues the opportunity to pursue areas of personal development.

This year, up to 10 colleagues will receive a grant of up to £2,000 which will go towards training, a course or qualification either in healthcare policy or in a similar field, related to HEE's Mandate and which aligns with our values.

Medical

Extended Surgical Team pilot - Year 2 progress report now available

The <u>Extended Surgical Teams (EST) pilot</u> from HEE began in November 2020 and was aimed at new 'extended' surgical teams, which is a trained multi-professional team supporting the entire surgical care pathway. The <u>year 2 progress report</u> is now available.

Enhancing junior doctors' working lives – less than full time training (LTFT)

As part of HEE's work to <u>enhance junior doctors' working lives</u>, several initiatives have been introduced to increase flexibility within postgraduate medical training.

<u>Gold Guide 9</u>, which is a reference guide for postgraduate foundation and specialty medical training in the UK, has now replaced the previous categories with an illustrative list of reasons for requesting LTFT training, including for wellbeing or non-medical development. Enhance (enhancing generalist skills) champion stories

HEE launched <u>enhance</u>: <u>Enhancing Generalist Skills</u> in April 2022. 150 learners have enrolled since then, and we are already receiving positive feedback from both enhance trailblazers and learners. <u>Discover more</u> about our enhance champions.

Nursing and midwifery

HEE launches new training to make General Practice Nursing (GPN) more accessible Nurses looking to start a role in General Practice can take a first step with this three-month module which aims to equip them for a potential application and interview.

The <u>training</u>, developed following feedback on why some applicants were failing to get through the recruitment process for GPN, is designed to improve understanding and awareness of General Practice and encourage pre-registration nurses to see the value and potential of a career in this area.

The module is available to nurses and nursing associates at all levels from pre-registration through to registered nurses working in different healthcare settings who want to start a career in general practice.

Training will be delivered using a variety of techniques from face-to-face learning to virtual reality. Topics include learning how the role fits within the multi-disciplinary team, developing one-to-one communications skills and understanding how to operate in a primary care environment.

Pharmacy

Funding for another year of independent prescribing courses for pharmacists

<u>Good news for pharmacists</u>: HEE is making more <u>independent prescribing courses</u> available from March. This training will enable eligible pharmacists to support patients from diagnosis to prescribing, and to provide advice and follow-up, while also helping them to feel confident and prepared for the new challenges of their role.

HEE is encouraging pharmacists from across sectors, including community pharmacy and locums, to take up this training opportunity.

Advanced Practice (AP)

An introduction to the Governance Maturity Matrix

Credible and consistent governance of advanced practice in the NHS can be challenging, but it is vital in ensuring advanced practitioners' safe, effective, and successful employment. NHS organisations can now use the Governance Maturity Matrix to help them navigate this and improve patient care.

The matrix was designed to enable NHS organisations to self-assess their progress around governing advanced practitioners and to facilitate improvement.

HEE has published the Advanced Clinical Practice in Midwifery Capabilities Framework which will enable organisations to put in place new midwifery roles, helping them better meet the needs of those who use their maternity services.

New multi-professional virtual network for advanced practice in learning disability and autism launched

A pilot network for Advancing Practice in Learning Disability or Autism has now been launched. The free-to-join facility is a place where aspiring, trainee and qualified advanced practitioners and consultants in learning disability and/or autism can go to get advice, peer support and to share best practice. It will also offer members the opportunity to influence the development of advanced practice roles. Please register to become a member.

Mental Health

New pilot to train thousands of staff working with children and young people in mental health

Thousands of staff members in children's services, including sports clubs, early years, childcare and more, are to be offered mental health training, so they are able to spot the early signs of mental health needs in the children and young people they come into contact with and know how to respond, thanks to a new HEE-funded programme.

A six-month evaluated pilot will take place in Southampton, Portsmouth and Norfolk in partnership with the Anna Freud National Centre for Children and Families, the Charlie Waller Trust and National Children's Bureau. <u>Find out more</u> about the training and <u>email the team</u> with any questions about the pilot.

Strategic Framework for Children and Young People's Mental Health Inpatient Workforce HEE is pleased to announce the publication of the <u>Strategic Framework for Children and Young People's Mental Health Inpatient Workforce.</u>

This framework, which was co-produced in partnership with young people, parents and carers, NHS England, the National Workforce Skills Development Unit (NWSDU) and partners, sets out how the vision can be achieved by developing a sustainable and consistent approach to children and young people's mental health inpatient services, workforce, supply and design.

We urge local health systems to understand, advocate and implement essential system-wide recommendations to develop their children and young people's mental health inpatient workforce.

Children and Young People's Mental Health (CYPMH) workforce census

The <u>CYPMH workforce</u> census highlights a 5 per cent increase in whole time equivalent (WTE) staff across CYPMH services between March 2021 and March 2022. The results of the census will enable us to work collaboratively with key strategic partners to inform the development of education, workforce planning and investment.

Training Programme to meet the Medical Needs of Adults with Learning Disabilities

A <u>new training programme</u> has been made available for senior healthcare professionals who care for people with a learning disability, including:

- General Practitioners (GPs) or GP registrars (ST3)
- Psychiatrists or psychiatry registrars (ST5-6)
- General medicine consultants or registrars (ST5-7)
- Registered Nurses Band 6 or 7 upwards (depending on the role)

Allied Health Professionals - Band 6 or 7 upwards (depending on the role).

Funded by HEE and created by the Royal College of Physicians (RCP) and Edge Hill University, the training is designed to help services meet the medical needs of adults with a learning disability and provide high-quality and person-centred care.

Those who complete both modules will receive a postgraduate certificate. The second of the two modules will be available from autumn 2023. Please <a href="mailto:emai

New Pan-London General Practice Nursing and Nursing Associate (NA) Competency Framework underway

North East London Integrated Care System (ICS) training hub has successfully bid to lead the pan-London work to develop a General Practice Nurse (GPN) and Nursing Associate (NA) Competency Framework for Academic and Foundation Programmes, in partnership with City, London University and University of East London. We plan to start delivering our proposed outcomes by **May 2023**.

Much of the work will be undertaken by 4 task and finish groups: 'Literature Review', 'Subject Matter Experts', 'Health Education Institutes', and 'General Practice Nurses'. This will ensure the framework is underpinned by a literature evidence base, created by experts in their field, aligned to educational programmes, and reviewed by the right people.

Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training

The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training on Learning Disability and Autism is named after Oliver McGowan, whose story has highlighted the need for health and social care staff to have better training in understanding, communicating with, and treating people with a learning disability and autistic people.

The training aims to ensure the health and care workforce has the right skills and knowledge to provide safe, compassionate and informed care to autistic people and people with a learning disability.

The Oliver McGowan Training is designed in two tiers so all staff working across all Care Quality Commission (CQC)-registered services receive the right level of mandatory training. Systems have been provided with 2022/23 funding to enable capacity development. London providers are being encouraged to:

- ensure that all staff undertake the required tier of training and to have mechanisms in place to quantify the numbers trained
- put forward colleagues onto train-the-trainer programmes.

Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) Easy Read guide now available

The NHS London Safeguarding Team and the Royal College of GPs have been working in collaboration with Building Bridges and Mojatu Foundation to co-produce an <u>FGM easy read</u> guide.

The aim of the easy read is to provide professionals working with someone with a learning disability with a guide to explain:

- what FGM is, why it happens and the possible health implications
- the legal implications of carrying out FGM
- what to do if they think FGM has been done to them

what to do if they think it might be done to them and where to get help.

Supporting survivors of FGM with cervical screening

The NHS London Safeguarding Team, in partnership with Leeds Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) and the Leeds FGM Blossom Clinic, has developed an <u>animation</u> based on trauma informed care, to enable health professionals to have conversations with survivors of FGM regarding cervical screening.

Feedback from FGM survivors, midwives, GPs, practice nurses, community organisations and clinics that support survivors of FGM and sexual violence was incorporated into the animation.

Virginity Testing and Hymenoplasty multi-agency guidance now available

The NHS London Safeguarding Team, in partnership with the Department of Health and Social Care, National Police Chiefs Council, Royal College of Midwives, Royal College of Obstetrics and Gynaecologists and Karma Nirvana, has produced a summary of the Virginity Testing and Hymenoplasty: Multi-agency Guidance. The summary animation covers the new legislation, safeguarding responses (including consideration of forced marriage) and support for women and girls.

Expressions of Interest open to deliver learning disability and autism Advanced Practice Credentials

We are looking for Higher Education Institutes (HEIs) to deliver one or both of the following Advanced Practice Credentials in supporting people with learning disabilities, including autistic people, and the multi-professional Advanced Practice Credential in Autism.

A number of places will be funded by the National Learning Disability and Autism Programme across both the credentials. Regional faculties also have the option to support additional trainees within their standard Advanced Clinical Practice (ACP) offer.

Only HEIs with a centre-accredited advanced practice MSc programme, or those working towards accreditation, are eligible to deliver the credentials as part of a MSc Advanced Practice Programme.

Digital and technology

Breast cancer awareness eLearning now available

A <u>new eLearning course</u>, designed to help healthcare professionals promote breast awareness messaging, is now available.

Developed by the leading breast cancer awareness charity, CoppaFeel, the course provides information on delivering breast cancer education and health promotion. It enables healthcare professionals, including nurses, GPs, and midwives to highlight the importance of regular breast checking, particularly in younger people who may not be aware of their risk of developing breast cancer.

The module includes key topics such as describing signs and symptoms, exposing common breast cancer myths, recognising when to make referrals and signposting to key resources. Find out more and register for the course.
