From IAPT to NHS Talking Therapies for anxiety and depression: rebrand rollout now live

To continue raising awareness of mental health support and encouraging people to come forward for the mental health care they need, last week NHS England announced a new name for Improving Access to Psychological Therapies (IAPT) services: NHS Talking Therapies for anxiety and depression. This name was chosen following an extensive consultation process led by NHS England and HEE.

Dr Adrian Whittington, National Clinical Lead for Psychological Professions at NHS England and Health Education England, has co-authored a <u>blog</u> about the rebrand.

The rebrand roll out has started and will continue over the next 12 months. All services and stakeholders are encouraged to implement the changes using the rebrand resources and guidance available on the <u>Future NHS Platform</u> or the <u>NHS Talking Therapies rebrand folder</u>. Better outcomes for service users with complex mental illness – new online course available

<u>Maudsley Learning</u>, commissioned by HEE, is delivering a free, half-day interactive course, specially designed for primary care staff providing annual health checks to service users with complex mental and physical health needs. You can now view forthcoming dates and register.

The 'physical healthcare for people with severe mental illness' course, being run over a series of dates, is taught by mental health experts in the field. The course covers how physical health monitoring brings better outcomes for service users with serious mental illness.

Strategic framework for Children and Young People's Mental Health Inpatient Workforce We are pleased to announce the publication of the <u>Strategic Framework for Children and Young</u> <u>People's Mental Health Inpatient Workforce.</u>

This framework, which was co-produced in partnership with young people, parents and carers, NHS England, the National Workforce Skills Development Unit (NWSDU) and partners, sets out clearly how the vision can be achieved by developing a sustainable and consistent approach to children and young people's mental health inpatient services workforce supply and design.

We urge local health systems to understand, advocate and implement essential system-wide recommendations to develop their children and young people's mental health inpatient workforce.

Consultation on proposed changes to the mandatory qualifications criteria – open until 17 February

Learning from the last few years of apprenticeship delivery, the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education (IfATE) is undertaking a consultation around what improvements can be made in how qualifications are used and operate within apprenticeships.

The IfATE are <u>proposing changes to the requirements</u> that are used when deciding whether an apprenticeship should include a mandatory qualification (a qualification, which is mandated in the occupational standard) to be completed by an apprentice as part of their apprenticeship. Please <u>respond to the proposed changes</u> by midnight on **17 February 2023.**

Showcasing clinical and non-clinical careers via NHS Careers Untapped

<u>NHS Careers Untapped</u>, developed by 10 London trusts working in partnership, showcases clinical and non-clinical careers on lesser-known roles, that students may not have heard of in the NHS using videos and podcasts. The material is accessible to all young people aged between 13 and 18 years old.

NHS Health Careers have launched 'Step into the NHS', a <u>stakeholder toolkit</u> to help anyone involved in careers-related learning tell teachers about its schools programme. New breast cancer awareness eLearning now available

A <u>new eLearning course</u>, designed to help healthcare professionals promote breast awareness messaging, is now available.

Developed by the leading breast cancer awareness charity, CoppaFeel, the course provides information on delivering breast cancer education and health promotion. It enables healthcare professionals, including nurses, GPs, and midwives to highlight the importance of regular breast checking, particularly in younger people who may not be aware of their risk of developing breast cancer.

The module includes key topics such as describing signs and symptoms, exposing common breast cancer myths, recognising when to make referrals and signposting to key resources. <u>Find out more and register</u> for the course.
