#### **South East Quality update – Escalating Concerns**

Back in April this year, the HEE <u>Supporting and Escalating Concerns in Clinical Learning Environments during COVID-19 guidance</u> was shared. We did this to ensure that all students, trainees, and learners were informed of how they can raise any concerns related to their clinical learning environment via their professional/educational networks.

We are aware that the number of COVID-19 cases within the region are increasing and placing pressure upon trusts. Therefore, we want to ensure that all trainees/learners are aware of the process for them to escalate any concerns they may have. 
## Welcome to the SE Pre-registration Attrition and Improving Retention (RePAIR) Fellows

The <u>RePAIR programme</u> for Nurses, Midwives, and Allied Health Professionals (AHPs) aims to support their retention on programmes, facilitate employment into the NHS following completion of studies, and provide support for those who are newly qualified.

On 1 December, we will welcome three new RePAIR Fellows to the SE on a 12-month secondment. The RePAIR Fellows will engage with a range of stakeholders across health and care systems, with a focus on the practice placement learning environment. They will work with systems to identify and support interventions needed to ensure more student nurses, midwives and AHPs complete their studies.

The RePAIR Fellows will also work with stakeholders to help support the newly qualified transition into health and care employment and support their needs as newly qualified practitioners. All this work will be guided by a better understanding of the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on students and newly qualified practitioners.

#### Young people across the SE attended an online NHS careers event

Over 2,500 people in the south east, including pupils from 35 schools, recently watched an online interactive live event on careers in the NHS. Claire Wardle, Workforce Transformation Programme Manager in the south east region, organised the event for young people in years 10-13. The event, held on 17 November, was entitled Your Future in Health and Care.

"The event aimed to give an overview of the variety of careers in the NHS, career pathways, apprenticeships, and employability skills. It was a successful event that targeted school and college students across the South East," said Claire.

In total over 2,500 people <u>watched the live broadcast</u> with 437 people so far watching its recording. Participants provided positive feedback with lots of requests for further information on work experience opportunities and apprenticeships.

#### NHS launches renewed recruitment drive

We are a key partner in a renewed NHS recruitment drive launched on 11 November as the health service contends with the second wave of COVID-19. The 'We are the NHS' campaign aims to increase applications for both degree courses and direct entry jobs, seeking to build upon the existing 1.2 million-strong workforce and to shine a light on the incredible work they do.

Mental Health Nursing Competence and Career developed framework launched We have recently launched a new framework to support careers in mental health with a focus on nursing. # Publication: A Review of Innovative and Extended Roles with Mental Health Pharmacy

We have recently published <u>A Review of Innovative and Extended Roles with Mental Health Pharmacy</u> developed by a Pharmacy and Pharmacy Technician new roles in mental health task and finish group.

This review specifically explored, collated, and analysed available data on innovative and extended roles within mental health pharmacy' and was prepared through a literature search and discussions with a range of pharmacy professionals. Whilst it has captured a broad range of roles, we anticipate that there are many other exemplar roles pharmacy professionals are undertaking across the country and we are very keen to hear more about these moving forward.

#### **Interim Foundation Pharmacist Programme update**

Registration for the Interim Foundation Pharmacist Programme (IFPP) is open to the cohort of pre-registration pharmacists whose training and registration were disrupted by the first phase of the COVID-19 pandemic. The programme is also helping to accelerate pharmacist early years' education and training reform, in line with the NHS People Plan for 2020/21.

We have been listening to employers and supervisors about the IFPP and how we can help support them and provisional pharmacists over the next phase of the programme. #### Consultation on draft Standards for the Foot Health Workforce

Along with the Foot Health Consortium, we are launching a consultation between 23 November 2020 – 15 February 2021, to seek the views of stakeholders on a <u>draft set</u> of standards for the foot health practitioner and podiatry support workforce.

The Standards have been developed to support the NHS to effectively use the full skills mix of the foot health workforce to meet demand, by providing a clear understanding of the footcare treatments that foot health practitioners and the podiatry support workforce can safely perform. The needs and safety of patients are central to this work.

We would therefore value your <u>feedback about the Foot Health Workforce standards</u> <u>via the consultation</u> and look forward to hearing your comments and suggestions as we take this vital and important next step.



#### **Highest-ever GP trainee acceptances in NHS history**

Hard work is paying off, as figures published this week show the <u>highest-ever</u> <u>number of GPs entering training</u> - with 3,793 posts accepted, exceeding the mandated target of 3,250 - which is a 40% increase on the number of recruits from when we first started our recruitment drive back in 2014.

# We are ensuring core HEE work to support our NHS colleagues continues:

New NHS Education Contract – moving towards implementation in the SE We are now in the 'Implementation phase' leading up to the introduction of the new NHS Education contract on 1 April 2021. This new contract will replace all existing agreements between HEE and providers of placement and educational services for the provision of education and training for healthcare professionals. It also replaces all existing agreements HEE has with all providers of placement and educational services, including NHS, independent and voluntary sector placement providers, and higher educational institutes, faculties, schools, further education providers, and other education and training organisations.

This single NHS Education Contract will help achieve a nationally consistent approach to contracting and funding for education and training. This will make it easier for all parties to understand their obligations, how public funds are used, and what the public should expect in return for the money invested in training the healthcare workforce.

#### New Tri-Partite Agreement for undergraduate medical funding

From April 2021, HEE will be introducing an <u>Undergraduate Medical Education Tri-Partite Agreement</u> (UGME TPA) as a schedule of the new NHS Education Contract.

The TPA will provide a consistent, nationwide framework for managing the financial arrangements for providing undergraduate medical education between Medical Schools, NHS placement providers (secondary care and GP), and HEE. It will also align to governance structures that HEE has already introduced comprising of Regional and Local Medical School Liaison Committees.

#### Transparency is key in new education funding guide

We have published for the first time, the <u>NHS Education Funding Guide</u> that sets out what funding HEE provides to support the training of health care professionals.

This NHS Education Funding Guide describes HEE's funding to learners, educational institutions, employers, and placement providers to support the education and training of professional roles for the 2020 – 2021 financial year. This will be revised and republished annually and will accompany the Department of Health and Social Care's Education & Training Tariff guidance, also published annually.

#### **HEE award shortlist for Coronavirus patient information**

HEE national NHS Library and Knowledge Services team has been shortlisted for the Connecting Services and Information Award at the 2020 HSJ Awards. Focused on helping frontline clinicians talk with patients, their initiative on 'Improving access to Coronavirus information for specific patient groups and in accessible formats' was shortlisted despite the tough competition from over 1,000 entries. #### **Genomics 101 series of courses**



The Genomics Education Programme has launched <u>a collection of nine introductory</u> <u>courses as part of its Genomics 101 series</u>. These aim to provide an overview of the fundamentals of genomics and its applications in healthcare. Created for those with little or no previous knowledge of the subject, each course focuses on a key aspect of genomics and its use in healthcare.
