HEE to invest £10 million to expand the NHS and care workforce

On Tuesday 7 July, HEE announced that £10million will be invested to help support the growth of the clinical workforce. This money will go directly towards expanding the number of placements for people studying nursing, midwifery, and selected AHP degrees. This will help us reach the NHS manifesto, and Long Term Plan goal of delivering an additional 50,000 nurses. To find out more, read the <u>full update on HEE's national website</u>.

Bidding for additional healthcare course places and clinical placements expansion open until Friday 17 July

To help support the <u>growth of the clinical workforce</u>, more students will have the opportunity to apply for places on Nursing, Midwifery, and Allied Health Professional (AHP) courses in England, following unprecedented demand.

Universities can still bid for more healthcare course places to support future growth as the deadline has been extended to match the Clinical Placement Expansion Programme bids. If you are a university, you can apply for additional Nursing, Midwifery, and AHP places until Friday 17 July, via the <u>DfE's bidding portal</u>. There are also bidding forms for placement



providers/facilitators to complete, and these need to be returned to <u>educationfunding@hee.nhs.uk</u> by Friday 17 July at 17:00.

Digital transformation

COVID-19 has accelerated digital transformation across the NHS, and every NHS Trust must have a strong understanding of it. HEE has been working with NHS Providers, which has published a <u>guide to NHS digital leadership</u>. This <u>guide</u> aims to help NHS Trust boards lead their organisations into the next stage of digitisation.

HEE e-Learning for Health (e-LfH) updates

COVID-19 programme

The <u>COVID-19 e-LfH programme</u> is still being well-used by the health and care workforce, and since its launch, in March 2020, there have been 1.6 million session launches.

Recent updates on the COVID-19 e-LfH programme include:

- New resources for trainers on <u>infection prevention and control (IPC) in care homes</u> to support IPC trainers
- New resources for <u>Specially Sourced Items</u> to support the treatment of COVID 19: This currently comprises resources relating to Closed Suction Catheters and Central Venous Catheters
- New resources for returning doctors in primary care outlining the <u>Call Audit Review</u> which is part of the assurance process of the COVID-19 Clinical Assessment Service.

Making Every Contact Count (MECC) e-learning programme

HEE e-LfH team has worked with Healthy Dialogues, the Department of Health and Social Care, and the Lancashire Foundation Trust to update the MECC e-learning programme. The programme is designed to support learners in developing an understanding of public health and the factors that impact upon health and wellbeing and focuses on how asking MECC questions and listening effectively to people is a vital skill.

There are now four sessions within the programme:

- What is MECC and why it is important
- How to have a MECC conversation
- Signposting
- Five Ways to Wellbeing.

Remote teaching solution

HEE's Technology Enhanced Learning team (TEL) has worked with professions across the health and care sector to ensure the continued provision of education by accelerating the use of digital technologies.

During the COVID-19, HEE has conducted over 500 online interviews for Foundation Year 2 posts and is planning for a further 1,500 online interviews in October. This new method of working has received positive feedback and was considered to have advantages for students and trainees.

Congratulations to new Nursing Associates at Western Sussex Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust

Congratulations to five newly qualified Nursing Associates (see picture on right) working at Southlands, Worthing, and St Richard's at Western Sussex Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, who have qualified with the full support of their managers after completing their two-year foundation degrees.

Nursing associates work with people of all ages and in a variety of settings in health and social care, they are registered with the Nursing and Midwifery Council contributing to the core work of nursing, with the aim of freeing up Registered General Nurses (RGNs) to focus on more complex clinical care. The role also provides a new route to follow into graduate-level nursing.



A former Health Care Assistant (HCA), now nursing associate, Peggy-Jane Murrell working at Western Sussex Eye Care, Southlands said:

"Within my team, they could see there was a need for a nurse associate, so I had the full support of my manager to enrol on this course. It feels great that I can apply my new skills to benefit the team."

Deanna Gibbs was also an HCA before qualifying as a new nursing associate working on Castle ward in Worthing. Deanna said:

"It feels great to have qualified...I can now have a bay of patients that I can attend to and I just need a supervisor to assist with the tasks that we can't do." These include inserting an IV line or making a change to a patient's care plan."

Western Sussex Hospitals NHS Trust Chief Nurse, Dr Maggie Davies, added:

"I wish to say huge congratulations to Amy, Deanna, Sarah, Kirsty, and Peggy who have marked an exciting milestone with the start of thousands of nursing associates joining the NHS over the coming years – bringing with them valuable skills which will have a hugely beneficial impact on patients. They will support our RGNs to deliver safe, high-quality care, and crucially help free up their time to focus on more specialised areas of patient treatment."
