Impact of COVID-19 on students survey now live

The <u>Impact of COVID-19 on Students Survey (ICONS)</u> is still open. The survey will help HEE understand the experience of medical, dental, nursing, allied health professional (AHP) and healthcare science learners, whether they have stepped into clinical practice, into new environments to support frontline clinical services or have opted to continue with their academic studies.

The survey will focus on the support provided to learners during the pandemic key areas, such as induction, clinical supervision, and academic supervision. Importantly, the survey will provide an opportunity to hear from healthcare learners currently working or studying and will inform our approach to supporting these learners now and in the future.

Student midwife case study

This week we shared the <u>story of student midwife</u> Alicia Shirley Burnett from the University of West London. She tells us how it felt to have to opt-out of the extended placement when a family member was shielding, why she started a blog for midwifery students, and what she's learning about leadership and teamwork during COVID-19.

Alicia says:

"Whether you opted in or out you're still a student midwife. You are not alone. Know who your sources of support are and how to access them. It's okay to ask for support; it doesn't make you weak, in fact, it's pretty wise."

HEE e-Learning for Healthcare (e-LfH) updates

The <u>COVID-19 e-LfH programme</u> is still being well used by the health and care workforce and has been launched over 1.4 million times since it went live mid-March 2020.

The e-LfH team has recently added the following to their COVID-19 programme:

- A new learning path called "<u>Physical Healthcare for Staff in Mental Health Settings</u>"
- A second learning path for staff working in primary care and community settings called "Supporting Patient Mental Health for the whole workforce"
- A learning path to support <u>student nurses undertaking a general practice placement</u> as part of the COVID-19 response
- An ICU quick reference guide.

NHS Test and Trace

Colleagues at Public Health England working on the recently launched NHS Test and Trace service asked e-LfH to host the training resources for the staff working on the app. Due to the scale and pace of its roll out the usage of the programme has been incredible. Since the programme went live on 14 May 2020 there have been 1.34 million session launches.

Due to usage of the COVID-19 and Test and Trace programmes and an increase in usage on programmes including Care Certificate and End of Life Care, e-LfH has seen a new record number of sessions launches for one month (2.4 million launches).

Learning Hub launch

Since HEE's Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL) team released the Learning Hub at the end of May 2020, over 500 resources have been contributed by the health and care workforce - many in response to the COVID-19 efforts to support the sector.

These resources include videos, webinars, slide presentations, Q&A packs, simulation scripts, lesson plans, and weblinks to support system readiness, recovery, and beyond. To access the <u>Learning Hub</u>, users can log in using their e-LfH log in details or create a Learning Hub account.

This email inbox will be monitored closely by the senior dean team and should only be used where local resolution has not been possible.

The KSS Quality Team has confirmed their recovery and restoration plans and will begin to engage with external stakeholders around what this looks like in terms of quality interventions and processes over the coming months.
