Message from HEE's Interim Chief Executive, Professor Wendy Reid

Professor Wendy Reid wrote her <u>weekly message</u>, which focuses on revolutionising HEE's workforce contribution, both in the immediate and longer-term by building teams focussed on skills required, not professional backgrounds.

Update from the four Statutory Education Bodies sent to medical trainees

On Wednesday 3 June, HEE as part of the four Statutory Education Bodies sent a <u>letter</u> encouraging medical trainers, trainees, and educators to prioritise training and to develop clear plans to address the shortfall in experience that has resulted from the loss of training opportunities during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The <u>letter</u> also states that to maintain the essential pipeline of trained medical staff, resumption of training must be given full support and a very high priority as services are planned and reintroduced. It also provides updates on the <u>changes made to ARCP</u> <u>outcomes</u> to enable as many medical trainees as possible to progress their careers, in

circumstances where they have been unable to demonstrate the required competencies or time to sit a critical exam.

Impact of COVID-19 on students survey

On Monday 1 June, HEE launched the <u>Impact of COVID-19 on Students Survey (ICONS)</u>, which will remain open for four weeks. The survey will help HEE understand the experience of medical, dental, nursing, allied health professional (AHP) and healthcare science learners, whether they have stepped into clinical practice, into new environments to support frontline clinical services or have opted to continue with their academic studies.

The survey will focus on the support provided to learners during the pandemic key areas, such as induction, clinical supervision, and academic supervision. Importantly, the survey will provide an opportunity to hear from healthcare learners currently working or studying and will inform our approach to supporting these learners now and in the future.

Increasing training places for NHS Clinical Psychologists and Child and Adolescent Psychotherapists

HEE has recently announced <u>plans to expand the number of training places for NHS Clinical</u> <u>Psychologists and Child and Adolescent Psychotherapists</u>, from September 2020. During 2020/21, HEE also intends to increase the education and training commissions for both professional roles by 25% nationally (an increase of 140). The roles will contribute to the design, leadership, research, development, supervision, and delivery of psychological and psychotherapeutic care and treatment, for people of all ages.

HEE e-Learning for Healthcare (e-LfH) updates

The <u>COVID-19 e-LfH programme</u> is still being well used by the health and care workforce and has been launched over one million times since it went live mid-March 2020.

The e-LfH team has recently added the following to their COVID-19 programme:

• The <u>Supporting Student Nurses in General Practice</u> pathway which offers information, guidance, and resources for student nurses in general practice.
