

HEE South East COVID-19 Update Bulletin – 20 March 2020

This update covers education and training actions

HEE's priority is to ensure trainees and learners are kept informed of immediate changes to their training and recruitment as a result of COVID-19. Therefore, we have developed this weekly bulletin, which should be read in conjunction with the National HEE COVID-19 webpage here.

With increasing critical care demand, it may be that mixed teams of anaesthetists, intensivists, surgeons, physicians work with nursing and allied health profession staff from a variety of backgrounds to care for patients in differing environments. Local adaptation of teams will be required depending on local critical care and other service demands. Additional support should be identified in advance of being required to assist with the delivery of critical care services. Local surge protocols should be in place for this eventuality.

Cross-skill training for COVID-19:

This cross-skill training for pandemic COVID-19 document summarises an approach to the training of non-ICU members of staff with transferable and/or trainable/retrainable skills to facilitate safe and effective care of COVID-19 patients. To find out more visit here.

Medical training:

Communications to doctors in training

Regular communication with doctors in training will be occurring on a rolling basis. Doctors in training are encouraged to report any concerns to their TPD/Head of School and Trust Director of Medical Education.

HEE COVID-19 and plans for management of medical and dental training programmes

A letter was sent to trusts and GP practices on 10 March 2020, which reiterates and reinforces HEE's guidance developed for winter pressures and flu management. It provides

1 April 2020 rotation

The default position is that April rotations will now **NOT** occur. Please let us know if you have any concerns. The Supporting the COVID-19 response: Plans for Management of Medical Training Rotations letter can be found here.

Trainees who have **NOT** transferred to their planned training rotation but **were** due to receive a higher payment rate will still receive payment at a higher rate as planned.

ARCPs

The ARCPs **WILL** occur, but by virtual panels and feedback does not need to be given face to face, even for non-standard outcomes. Guidance for this will be sent out on a rolling basis and trainees will be contacted. Educational supervisor reports may become crucial, and we encourage supervisors to make sure that they are as good as they can be.

There will be no Penultimate Year Assessments (PYA's), please see national with local implementation letter here.

Recruitment and selection centres

Many recruitment and selection centres are being cancelled with information to be found on HEE's website here. Other recruitment and selection methods are being developed by HEE nationally, as national processes are still required.

Medical Schools Council

Medical School Council plans are in place to graduate as many doctors as possible where it is safe to do so with an update here.

HEE national statement on study leave

• The national study leave document can be viewed here. Trainees should endeavour to obtain a refund for any pre-booked expenses. If they are unable to do so we will



honour the claim, but they should provide evidence when they submit their claim that the expense was non-refundable.

- All requests for study leave time not taken during the outbreak will be properly
 considered by the employers and Postgraduate Deans and will be subject to the
 need to maintain NHS services, and training requirements for completion of
 programmes.
- When organisations cancel courses and training, can the Postgraduate Dean and their team please ensure that provision for essential courses such as ALS is still available to ensure patient safety remains a priority.
- We are asking all parties to be flexible both during and after this difficult time.

Academic doctors in training

All Academic doctors in training have been asked to return to the clinical service. The update and letter can be viewed <u>here</u>.

Multi-professional training needs

Students on placement are encouraged to liaise with both their placement provider and their Higher Education Institute (HEI), to seek both support and the latest guidance regarding multi-professional training needs.

Out of Programme (OOP) requests

New OOP applications will be stopped for now. We are reviewing decisions regards those already in training. HEE are reviewing the situation regarding those doctors in training who are currently out of programme.

Simulation training

National scoping on simulation is taking place to explore what HEE could provide. The 'preparing and responding to 2019 novel coronavirus with simulation and technology-enhanced learning for healthcare professional's guidance' can be viewed here. Dental training:

It has been decided to cancel all non-essential dental teaching with immediate effect.

Healthcare science recruitment:

HEE and the National School of Healthcare Science have decided to cancel the interview event for admission to the scientist training programme. Development of an alternative selection process is being urgently reviewed.



Releasing medical leadership to support the NHS:

As part of HEE's response to supporting the NHS in maintaining services for patients during the COVID-19 outbreak, we have taken the decision to release clinical staff currently working within HEE who wish to return to frontline services. The update and letter can be viewed here.

Quality processes:

- All routine quality visits have been postponed up to the end of September 2020. All
 quality issues will still require monitoring, and this will be done as pragmatically and
 supportively as possible.
- Although many have cancelled training and education events, please ensure that
 vital training such as resuscitation and life support is provided where needed and
 note F2 doctors that are being redeployed may need this.
- All doctors in training still require inductions and appropriate supervision.
- The GMC National Training survey has been postponed.

Kent, Surrey and Sussex (KSS) office:

KSS update:

- Kent, Surrey and Sussex staff are now working remotely and will not be in Stewart House or Crawley Hospital. They are well equipped and are available on e-mail, mobile and Skype.
- We will keep you updated as and when there are further developments around GP trainees, Foundation trainees, and medical students.

Pharmacy

Quality

Wessex quality team will continue to liaise with trust providers to keep up to date where concerns exist, particularly where triggered visits have been cancelled. This will be done in a proportionate way to minimise workload for providers.

There is significant ongoing work with HEI partners to support student placements and the role students will take in the coming months and this will continue. The anticipated national guidance will further inform this work. An update has been sent to all learners in Wessex from the Postgraduate Dean via HEIs and Directors of Medical Education to reassure them that HEE is working with system partners to consider the implications for their education and training.

The Wessex Quality Committee will continue to meet virtually in order to review current educational quality issues and deal with new concerns.

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For areas with significant concerns/risks, the quality team will work collaboratively with the Trust's DME to identify creative processes for receiving direct feedback from trainees in a way that doesn't disrupt service or involve face to face meetings.

HEE's next steps:

Medical

HEE will be developing selection processes to replace cancelled interviews and will finalise and communicate guidance on ARCPs as well as develop further information for trainees on the impacts of these changes.

Nursing and Midwifery

HEE is working with partners including the NMC, NHS England and NHS Improvement and HEIs to ensure we are doing everything we safely can to maximise the contribution current students and trainees can and will make to frontline services and dealing with the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak. This includes responding to requests from many students and former registered nurses who have contacted to offer support to frontline colleagues by trying to create a UK wide policy and guidance to support those students and registered nurses in doing this.

HEE is working directly with the Chief Nursing Officers from the four nations on combined response to support returners, redeployment of HEE and other Arm's Length Body nursing staff and students to the front line.

HEE is also in discussion with students, unions, universities and the Council of Deans to agree a safe, pragmatic and fair way to allow students to play a role in dealing with COVID-19. National guidance will be issued very shortly.



Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC)

The HCPC are working with the government to enable the following groups to practice on a temporary basis.

- Former HCPC registrants who have de-registered within the last three years.
- Final year HCPC students, on UK approved programmes, who have completed all their clinical practice placements.

Supporting colleagues through e-Learning

HEE e-Learning for Healthcare is currently collating relevant e-learning content from the existing catalogue for the health and care workforce into one programme to support the COVID-19. We will share where this content will be as soon as it is ready.

The HEE TEL team is also scoping current practise and potential capacity to upscale simulation-based training for the NHS response to COVID-19 and organisations are being asked to submit their responses to a survey on this by Friday.

These programmes, as well as working closely with NHS England and NHS Improvement and the Department of Health and Social Care on policy and regulatory issues, are part of a coordinated and focussed effort to ensure all efforts are being made to deal with this virus.
