Stop Look Care

Our Primary Care Programme funded Helen Rignall, Primary Care Workforce Tutor at Brighton and Hove CCG who co-created the 'Stop Look Care' resource. This was designed to support carers undertaking the National Care Certificate and act as a reference guide for families and personal assistants to promote awareness of certain needs and encourage referral if concerns were identified.

The booklet had been so successful across Brighton and Hove that it won the [Nursing Times Award 2018 - Care of Older People](#) (pg. 6). We have also funded the development of a mental health version through our Training Hubs via our mental health programme. Kent & Medway STP are also developing the Stop Look Care App.

Kent Trust employing more people with a Learning Disability

Working alongside the HEE South ID Programme, East Kent Hospitals University NHS FT successfully developed their skills and implemented NHS England and Employers [Learning Disability Employment Pledge](#). They have reviewed their recruitment and selection processes by removing barriers, redesigned job roles and initiated culture change making their workforce more inclusive. As a result, they have recruited 2 individuals into job roles especially created for those with a learning disability.

Sonography Target Achieved

The HEE Third Trimester Sonography Programme have boosted numbers of qualified sonographers by 200. As a result, there will be an improved access to scans during later pregnancy, with the hope this will pick up more babies in difficulty. Our Local Office would like to thank all involved across the KSS region who helped us achieve this target.



Frimley Health Palliative Care Service delivers better care for patients & decreases length of stay

Frimley's front of house nurse led service has been delivered within their Emergency Department and Acute Medical Unit by 2 Specialist Nurses. The nurses carry out assessments to support identification of appropriate patient, decision-making, DNA CPR discussions, and symptom control as well as support families, discharges and liaison with community teams.

Over the past 2 years the average length of stay for all patients referred to the Palliative Care Service has decreased by 5 days and 96% of all patients seen achieved their preferred place of care/death.

Newly qualified nursing associates will benefit from a structured preceptorship programme that offers support and guidance as they transition from trainee to registrant.

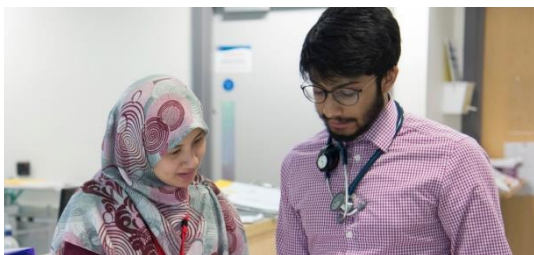
To support this, HEE have produced best practice guidance on preceptorship for nursing associates.
