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# National workforce, training and education news

#### Creating a new NHS England

Health Education England has merged with NHS England. This means that NHS England has assumed responsibility for all activities previously undertaken by Health Education England. This includes planning, recruiting, educating and training the health workforce, ensuring that the healthcare workforce has the right numbers, skills, values and behaviours in place to support the delivery of excellent healthcare and health improvement to patients and the public.

This follows the merger of NHS Digital with NHS England on the 1 February 2023. The systems and services, functions, processes and structures of Health Education England will continue to operate as normal, and contracts will automatically transfer to NHS England, with terms and conditions unchanged.

# Equality Impact Assessment survey – open until 2 June

As part of our Equality Impact Assessment on COVID-19 Training Recovery Interventions, we have launched a survey for all postgraduate doctors in training to share their experiences of training since March 2020. Findings will help shape improvements to postgraduate medical training aimed at achieving educational equality in terms of opportunity and outcome.

# 'Discovering a nursing career in General Practice' module available

Nurses looking to start a role in general practice can now undertake a three-month module to gain a better understanding of the role and assist with applications to general practice nursing. The module is currently being rolled out across the country.

# Allied Health Professions (AHP)

#### AHP Educator Career Framework

The AHP Educator Career Framework has been designed for all AHPs at all career stages, and to support a sustainable and high-quality educator workforce both in practice and in academic settings.

Hosted on the Council of Deans of Health website, the framework describes the knowledge, skills and behaviours required to be an effective teacher, learning facilitator and role model in AHP education across all career stages and should be seen as an important first step in establishing a national standard for the AHP education workforce.

The full report contains a review of the existing career and education frameworks for all Allied Health Professions and a targeted literature review of key publications.

#### CAHPO Awards 2023 – nominations open until 9 June

The Chief Allied Health Professions Officer (CAHPO) awards are an annual opportunity to recognise and celebrate the vital contribution and impact that Allied Health Professions (AHPs) make towards improving health, care, and wellbeing, of the people and population they serve. This year, the awards will take place virtually on 12 October. Nominate yourself or an AHP colleague before 9 June.

## Diagnostic Radiographer (Integrated Degree) (Level 6) Apprenticeship Completion

The Level 6 Diagnostic Radiographer (Integrated Degree) Apprenticeship was approved for delivery in April 2019 and the duration of this gateway is typically 36 months. The first round of students to undertake this course completed it in March 2023. Those who successfully completed the programme are eligible to register with the Health and Care professions Council (HCPC) and work under the title of a diagnostic radiographer.

To celebrate this, we have launched a suite of video interviews and case studies, which include details of their experiences and perspectives from apprentices, as well as educators. Take a look at the new resources.

## New specialist perinatal mental health Routine Outcome Measures online learning

NHS England, in partnership with Anna Freud and partners, has now made available a new elearning programme for healthcare professionals working in specialist perinatal mental health services.

The 'Specialist Perinatal Mental Health – Routine Outcome Measures' elearning will help staff to use routine outcome measures to continually assess the results of the care and treatment they provide to patients in order to, where appropriate, make adjustments and improvements.

## Open online mental health learning to better support pregnant women and up to 24 months after birth

NHS England, in partnership with the Parent-Infant Foundation, has launched the online Perinatal and Infant Mental Health learning programme. This elearning is free to use and has been designed to upskill and increase awareness of perinatal mental health among professionals working in a range of settings supporting women during pregnancy and up to 24 months after birth, including maternity services, primary care, charities, and community groups.

#### GP Specialty Trainee 3 and 4 Career Intentions survey open until 28 June

The survey is open to all GP specialty trainees due to qualify and gain their Certificate of Completion of Training during summer 2023 and seeks to find out more about their intentions on completing training now, and over the next 2-5 years.

Previous survey findings have been shared with service commissioners, educators and training hubs to inform:

- future workforce development opportunities for newly-qualified GPs
- the development of recruitment and retention initiatives that address the factors that influence career choice.

By completing the survey, participants are consenting to take part and for responses to be used in the final analysis. Survey participants will find further resources and career development support at the end of the survey. The survey will be analysed by NHS England, and all responses will be anonymised.
