<u>Greener Practice</u>, the UK's primary care sustainability network, has created a GP Trainee forum to facilitate the exchange of knowledge and ideas on sustainable healthcare between GP trainees. <u>Sign up</u> to join Greener Practice.

First womb transplant performed in the UK

After more than 25 years of research, a team has performed <u>the first womb</u> transplant in the UK.

More than 30 NHS staff, including surgeons, nurses, anaesthetists and technicians at <u>Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust</u> and <u>Oxford University Hospitals (OUH)</u> <u>NHS Foundation Trust</u> worked together over an 18-hour period to complete the life-changing procedure.

Mental Health

Improving outcomes for autistic people and people with a learning disability – forthcoming webinars

Partners in Care and Health is offering a <u>series of free webinars</u> to support councils and Integrated Care Board (ICB) partners to support their work in improving outcomes with autistic people and people with a learning disability.

The <u>Community Alternatives to Inpatient Care webinar</u> on **22 September (12 midday-2pm)** will update attendees on:

- the development of a maturity matrix to reflect on the community services that need to be available and how it is informing planning
- the collaboration to commission and co-produce a Community Adult Autism Support Service in South East London ICB and Oxleas NHS Foundation Trust, which has reduced the number of autistic people being admitted to mental health hospitals
- the actions and approaches used in Staffordshire across the ICB and council to reduce the numbers of people with a learning disability and autistic people being admitted to hospital.
