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# National workforce, training and education news

#### Medical

#### Stroke-specific education framework survey

The Stroke-Specific Education Framework Research Team, funded by NHS England (NHSE) Workforce (Training and Education Directorate), has launched a nationwide survey to determine the training needs of healthcare staff providing comprehensive stroke services in England to inform improvements in strokespecific workforce development.

Please share with your networks and take the survey if you have a role in the stroke health and social care workforce and have information to share that can help identify current stroke-specific learning needs of those working in stroke care.

#### Safe prescribing for NHS staff

Foundation doctors and dentists, paediatric trainees, nurses, general practitioners, pharmacists and other non-medical prescribers can access free elearning programmes, hosted by SCRIPT, which support safer prescribing.

The programmes are supported by the NHSE Technology Enhanced Learning Team (TEL) and are appropriate for undergraduate medical, pharmacy and nursing students. Access is free to anyone with a NHS.uk or NHS.net address and each completed module is certified which can be added to online learning portfolios.

### **Pharmacy**

#### New NHS-funded training for community pharmacy staff

Community pharmacy staff are being offered a range of fully-funded, flexible training to expand their clinical skills and improve patient care. Courses include Clinical Examination Skills and Independent Prescribing.

Specialist modules are tailored to suit skills, experience and individual learning requirements. Complete the Clinical Examination Skills gateway module in approximately 1 hour online, followed by one of four specialist modules in cardiology, paediatrics, dermatology, or ear, nose and throat (ENT). Optional inperson, practical training sessions are also available. Find out more and register for Clinical Examination Skills training or Independent Prescribing courses.

#### Mental Health

Eating disorder online Community of Practice sessions openly available for GP, primary care and nursing workforce

NHS data suggest that eating disorders affect 6.4 per cent of the UK population. NHSE is working in partnership with the charity Beat to deliver an online Community of Practice for the GP, primary care and nursing workforce working with people with eating disorders throughout 2023-24. The Community of Practice provides monthly, hour-long, group support sessions with a Beat clinician following completion of the related elearning programmes.

Oliver McGowan draft code of practice on statutory learning disability and autism training – consultation open until 19 September

The Government has launched a consultation on the Oliver McGowan Draft Code of Practice, which outlines how health and care providers, who are registered with the Care Quality Commission (CQC), can meet the legislative requirement introduced by the Health and Care Act 2022 to ensure staff receive training on learning disability and autism, appropriate to their role.

The public consultation on the draft code of practice will run for 12 weeks. Interested individuals and groups can respond to the consultation up until 19 September.

Following this, the Government will consider all consultation responses to inform final changes to the draft Code of Practice.

Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training on Learning Disability and Autism: updated frequently asked questions

#### Changes to Foundation Trainee Pharmacist Training

From January 2024, the National Recruitment Scheme (NRS), via Oriel, will become the single-entry route to obtain a funded-Foundation Training Year place for employers.

Training sites will be required to confirm that they will meet the Terms of Participation for the 2025/26 training year in early 2024, but will then have a longer time period to establish detailed arrangements prior to trainees starting. Full Terms of Participation will be available in Autumn 2023. Bookmark the NRS/Oriel website and email the team with future enquiries.
