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# National workforce, training and education news

#### **NETS**

#### National Education and Training Survey (NETS) opens 3 October

The NETS, running 3 October to 28 November, is the only national survey open to all undergraduate and postgraduate students and trainees undertaking a practice placement or training post in healthcare, as part of their education and training programme.

The survey gathers opinions from students and trainees about their time working and training in practice placements and training posts, asking them to provide feedback on what worked well and what they think could be improved.

Please share the survey with your networks and complete the survey from 3 October.

## Medical

### Forthcoming Distribution of Specialty Training posts webinars

# **Pharmacy**

#### New campaign to help people save money on prescriptions

A new NHS England campaign aims to raise awareness of prescription saving schemes. The campaign is specifically targeting those living with long-term conditions as well as people living in deprived areas, as data shows these populations receive significantly more prescription items than those living in less deprived areas.

People on a low income could be entitled to help with costs or even free prescriptions through the low income scheme, depending on their circumstances.

A Prescription Prepayment Certificate will save people money if they pay for more than three items in three months, or 11 items in 12 months. The certificate covers all NHS prescriptions for a set pre-paid price, which can also be spread over 10 direct debit payments. People can check their eligibility via the low income scheme eligibility checker.

#### Newly-qualified pharmacist pathway 2023/24

A newly-qualified pharmacist pathway aims to help pharmacists make the transition to more independent learning and acts as a stepping-stone towards enhanced and advanced practice. Pharmacists can access:

- the **E-portfolio**: mapped to the RPS post-registration foundation pharmacist curriculum
- the RPS post-registration foundation pharmacist curriculum which is designed to support pharmacists progress, from meeting the initial standards of education and training through to being confident practitioners who can provide increasingly complex care
- a curated <u>learning resource library</u>
- supervision via this pathway.

#### Easy read Oliver McGowan Code of Practice consultation open until 16 October

The easy read version of the Oliver McGowan code of practice consultation is open. Share with your networks and submit your feedback on the draft Code by 16 October.

#### 'People Promise in action' week (9-13 October)

The Long Term Workforce Plan (LTWP) sets out how we must build on the actions in the NHS People Promise, and make the People Promise a reality to help retain our existing talent.

NHS England is hosting a 'People Promise in action' week to focus on the People Promise and explain how putting the seven elements into action can help retain our existing talent, in line with the LTWP.

Throughout the week, you can hear first-hand from organisations about how they are supporting existing colleagues by putting the People Promise into action and improving experiences at work.

The events will be open to all colleagues who lead and line manage people, from board to ward, and colleagues with staff experience within their portfolios. Each day will have a different focus and offer resources to support you on your organisation's retention journey.

#### Registered Midwife Degree Apprenticeship – new evaluation report published

NHS England's Workforce Training and Education Directorate, in partnership with the Royal College of Midwives (RCM), has published the Registered Midwife Degree Apprenticeship (RMDA) evaluation report. You can find a short version of the report.

Kings College London was commissioned to conduct the evaluation, surveying apprentices and interviewing representatives from universities and employers and reviewing data provided by universities.

The report concludes that the RMDA offers a sustainable means of boosting workforce capacity to meet local need, improving staff retention and support the implementation of a more diverse workforce.
