New pilot training programmes for singles accreditation in General Internal Medicine launched this July

Health Education England is responding to a number of hospital trusts that are now (re)opening departments in General Internal Medicine by setting up some pilot training programmes for single accreditation in GIM. These pilot programmes, which are in 3 regions (East and West Midlands and Wessex) are looking to recruit their first trainees in Autumn 2022 with trainees starting in post late 2022/early 2023.
