This guide has been created by Health Education England (HEE) to support the newly published Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) Education and Training Tariff Guidance document for financial year 2022 to 2023. For the financial year 2022 to 2023 a number of changes have been agreed, including prices scope and eligibility.

4. Clinical tariff

4.1 – 4.10	4.1	 Changes to the clinical tariff for 2022 to 2023 are as follows: The clinical tariff placement fee has been uplifted for 2022 to 2023 from 1st April to reflect inflation. From the 1st September 2022, the clinical tariff placement fee will increase to £5,000 + MFF. This will apply to all current and future placement activity within the scope of tariff arrangements.

		The scope of the clinical tariff placement fee has been extended to include Pharmacy (4-year MPharm degree programme) for the first time. This will apply from 1st September 2022.
4.11	4.2	The list of clinical professions that are eligible for the clinical placement tariff has been updated. Pharmacy (4-year MPharm degree programme) training is

NA - new	4.0	The guidance now provides confirmation that if a clinical profession is not listed in section 4.2, it is not eligible for tariff funding. NA - new	4.4	Confirmation that international students/trainees are eligible for the clinical tariff for eligible professions.
NA – new	4.5 – 4.8	These sections of the guidance provide clarification regarding the eligibility and scope for pharmacy from 1st September 2022.
4.2 – 4.5	4.9 – 4.10	The section from the 2021 to 2022 guidance relating to what constitutes an FTE has been moved to this section to ensure continued clarity regarding this issue and acknowledgement that this process is now considered business as usual.
4.7 – 4.10	4.11 – 4.14	The section from the 2021 to 2022 guidance relating to simulation-based learning has been moved to this section to ensure continued clarity regarding this issue and acknowledgement that this process is now considered business as usual.
		Section 4.11 also now clarifies when HEE will pay for simulation activity.
		4.12 confirms that HEE will not pay for simulation activity that forms part of activity delivered by education providers as part of their teaching requirements.

5.2	5.1 – 5.3	Confirmation is provided regarding the changes to the medical undergraduate tariff in 2022 to 2023.
		From the 1st April 2022 this has been uplifted to reflect inflation within the outcomes of the spending review.
		From the 1st September 2022, DHSC and HEE have introduced a consistent national tariff price for all medical undergraduate placements of £30,750 + MFF, extending the tariff arrangements to include primary care and private, independent and voluntary sectors.
5.11	NA - removed	Dental undergraduate placements now have their own tariff arrangements so this paragraph was removed from the 2022 to 2023 guidance.
5.12 – 5.15	NA	These paragraphs were removed from the 2022 to 2023 guidance due to the introduction of the single tariff payment, irrespective of placement setting.

6. Dental undergraduate Tariff (new)

NA - new	6.1 – 6.11	Dental undergraduate training had previously been out of scope of tariff and its ET funding arrangements were subject to local arrangements.

From 1st September 2022, there is now a dental undergraduate tariff of £32,259 + MFF.
Further details about payment and scope, eligibility, tri-partite agreement and exclusions for this tariff type can be found in section 6 of the tariff guidance and in Annex D.

6.4	7.4	Confirmation that the medical postgraduate tariff is not applicable to the Out of Programme Pause (OOPP) pilot.

The salary contributions that HEE will pay for each medical postgraduate placement has been updated to account for the inflationary uplifts agreed as part of the junior doctor contract reform in 2016 to 2017. Please see the tariff guidance for full details.
